# **Bylaws of the Rotary Club of**

## **Tiruvallur**

#### AMENDMENT 2019-20 on 15-03-2020

#### **Definitions**

- 1. Board: The Board of Directors of this Club
- 2. Director: A member of this Club's Board of Directors.
- 3. Member: A member, other than an honorary member, of this Club.
- 4. RI: Rotary International.
- 5. Year: The twelve-month period that begins on 1 July.

#### **ARTICLE VII -- FEES AND DUES**

#### Section 7 a

**Fees and Dues – No Increase**. Membership dues, admission fees, and related charges shall remain unchanged for the current Rotary year (1 July 2020 – 30 June 2021).

### **Article 17 A: Membership Admission**

## 1. Eligibility Requirements

- Membership in the Rotary Club is open to individuals who meet the following criteria:
  - Exhibit good character, integrity, and leadership.
  - Possess the willingness and ability to serve the community in alignment with the club's goals.
  - Agree to abide by the Rotary International and Rotary Club bylaws and Code of Conduct.

#### 2. Membership Proposal and Nomination

- A candidate for membership must be sponsored by a current member in good standing.
- The sponsoring member shall submit a proposal form to the club secretary, including the candidate's background, community involvement, and reasons for membership interest.
- A committee designated by the club board (such as a Membership Committee) will review the proposal to ensure eligibility and alignment with the club's values.

#### 3. Notification and Objection Period

- The proposed candidate's information will be shared with the club members, providing a 7-day period for members to raise any objections.
- Objections must be submitted in writing to the club secretary. Any objections will be confidentially reviewed by the club's Membership Committee or Board.

## 4. Approval Process

- If no valid objections are raised, the Membership Committee or Board will vote on the candidate's admission.
- A simple majority vote by the Membership Committee or a two-thirds vote by the club's board is required for approval.
- Upon approval, the candidate will be invited to join the club and complete an orientation session within 30 days of acceptance.

## 5. **Induction Ceremony**

 New members shall be formally inducted into the club during a regular club meeting, where they will receive their membership pin and Rotary literature.

## 6. Including a New member in Rotary international

 New members shall be added to the Rotary International membership only during the final week of June or December, aligning with semiannual reporting periods, regardless of prior subscription payment.

## 7. **General Body Approval.**

Acceptance of new members or reinstatement of former members requires affirmative decision by the general body at a duly convened meeting. Proposals approved by the board shall be published to members; if no objection is received within seven days, or if approved despite objection, final induction awaits general body ratification.

## 8. Refunds on Rejection.

 In case of rejection of a new member proposal or reinstatement by the general body, all subscriptions, admission fees, or other dues paid shall be fully refunded without deduction.

## **Article 18: Membership Removal**

#### 1. Grounds for Membership Removal

- A member may be subject to removal for any of the following reasons:
  - Violation of Rotary International's Code of Conduct or club bylaws.
  - Failure to pay dues within the period specified by the club's financial policies.
  - Inactivity, defined as absence from a majority of club meetings or events without valid reasons for a period of six months.
  - Any behavior that damages the reputation or well-being of the club, its members, or Rotary International.

# 2. Procedure for Removal(Other than Nonpayment of Subscription)

- Written Notice: The member in question will receive a written notice outlining the reasons for possible removal, along with any relevant evidence. The member will be granted 14 days to respond in writing.
- Hearing: Upon receiving the response, the Membership Committee or Board may schedule a hearing, giving the member an opportunity to present their case in person.
- Voting for Removal: Following the hearing, the board will vote on whether to proceed with removal. A two-thirds majority vote is required for the removal decision to pass.

# 3. Appeal Process(if removed Other than Nonpayment of Subscription)

- A removed member may file a written appeal within 30 days of the removal decision.
- The club board or a designated appeal committee will review the appeal within 30 days, after which a final decision will be made.

#### **Reinstatement of Membership**

- A former member who was removed for nonpayment or inactivity may request reinstatement after a minimum period of 6 months.
- The reinstatement process requires the member to fulfill any financial obligations owed to the club and undergo a review by the Membership Committee.
- A simple majority vote by the Membership Committee or board is required for reinstatement.

## **Article 19: Amendments to Membership Bylaws**

# 1. Amendment Proposal

- Any proposed amendment to the membership bylaws must be submitted in writing to the club secretary.
- The proposal will be reviewed by the club's bylaws committee (or equivalent committee) and presented to the club board.

#### 2. Approval of Amendments

• Amendments to these membership bylaws require a two-thirds majority vote of the club's board and ratification by a majority of club members.

#### 3. Notification of Amendments

All members shall receive written notification of any bylaw amendments within 30 days of ratification.
